## Readout of the U.S. Department of Education's Remote Learning Best Practices During the COVID-19 Pandemic

U.S. Secretary of Education Betsy DeVos hosted the second in a series of <u>forums</u> with K–12 education leaders the week of June 10 to discuss best practices for remote learning, including lessons learned during the COVID-19 pandemic. More than 2,000 education leaders from across the country listened in as educators from Arizona, Connecticut, Indiana, Louisiana, Mississippi, and North Carolina discussed how they established innovative virtual learning capabilities to serve students and teachers now and in the future.

## **Secretary DeVos Approves Perkins Career and Technical Education State Plans**

Secretary DeVos has announced the approval of the first two groups of state career and technical education (CTE) plans by the Department. On May 22, Hawaii, Illinois, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, and New Hampshire were the first to have their CTE plans approved under the new, bipartisan Strengthening Career and Technical Education for the

21st Century Act (Perkins V), which was signed into law by President Donald J. Trump on July 31, 2018. Subsequently, Secretary DeVos announced the approval of plans by Georgia, Iowa, Michigan, Montana, North Dakota, Oregon, South Dakota, Vermont, and Wyoming and then the plans of Arizona, Idaho, Kansas, Louisiana, Missouri, Nebraska, Oklahoma, Texas, Wisconsin, and the District of Columbia.

Perkins V encourages states to expand opportunities for every student to access education opportunities that will put them on the path to success. Each state crafted a plan to fulfill its promise of offering a robust CTE option for students following consultation with its key Constituents representing education and workforce, business and industry, and parents and community partners.

"Our Perkins plan raises the bar for CTE in Illinois," said Illinois State Superintendent of Education Dr. Carmen I. Ayala. "We now have higher standards for program quality, equity, and access, as well as tools and strategies to help programs meet these higher standards. Our plan included funding to incentivize deeper connections between students and employers. Strong career and technical education will help Illinois rebuild our economy after COVID-19 and equip our students with the skills and experiences they need to succeed in a 21st century workforce."

# U.S. Department of Labor Announces Next Step Toward Better Connecting Transitioning Service Members Skills with Employers' Needs

An announcement was made by The U.S. Department of Labor that three finalists have been chosen to build an application to better match <u>transitioning service members</u>' skills with employer needs. The field testing will begin on June 22, 2020. The three finalists, Eightfold, LinkedIn, and Square Peg Hires, will present their software solutions to transitioning service members from various Army installations through virtual Transition Assistance Program courses.

As learning environments transitioned from the classroom to virtual and in-home platforms, the West Virginia Family Engagement Center (WVFEC) began hosting a series of family focused webinars to explore education opportunities for students and families at home during school closures. The topics of the Strong Families Learning Series include social-emotional learning, physical and collaborative activities, virtual learning, practicing mindfulness, creating a learning space, maintaining calm, and making memories. Support services are provided to veterans through the <u>Veteran Employment Services Office (VESO)</u> (formerly known as VA for Vets). VESO's training provides transitioning services for service members seeking VA employment and helps demystify the federal hiring process. The program

teaches veterans how to match their job skills and education with career counseling that best aligns with federal occupations. It also helps speed up the hiring process for vets.
