

Dr. Can Kultur, currently Fulbright Scholar in Residence at Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology in Terre Haute, Indiana, visited area institutions April 15-16, 2015 as part of Bluefield State College's **Windows on the World Lecture Series.** Pete Sternloff of Bluefield, West Virginia, hosted Dr. Mihoc in his home.

Dr. Kultur discussed "Life in Turkey Today" with students, teachers, and administrators of Princeton Senior High School.

He discussed "Human Factor and Software Design" with computer science students of Professor Lionel Craddock and Dr. Adem Ozyvas of Bluefield State College and to business information systems students at Concord University.

Dr. Kultur is an excellent example of an academician who knows how to commercialize knowledge. He not only teaches at Bilkent University in Turkey but his professional interests include human computer interaction, multimedia, technology adoption processes in universities, and instructional systems design and development. He has 10 years of industry experience in software engineering including various management roles. He is also one of the founders of a startup company in Turkey and is working on a distance education project to support learning vocabulary as a foreign language.
