

Dr. Volodymyr Dankiv, Fulbright Scholar in Residence at Umpqua Community College, Roseburg, Oregon, visited area institutions April 20-21, 2015 as part of Bluefield State College's **Windows on the World Lecture Series.** Doris Sue and Norris Kantor of Bluefield, West Virginia, hosted Dr. Dankiv in their home.

A specialist in operational risk management and retail/credit risk management in the banking environment in the Eastern European Emerging Market, Dr. Dankiv has extensive executive banking experience in Ukraine and England.

Dr. Dankiv briefed executives of First Community Bank about operational risk management and retail/credit management in banking.

He discussed "Mobile payments and payment platforms" with students, teachers, and administrators of BSC's School of Engineering Technology and Computer Science, Dr. John Snead's financial management students, and Concord University's business students..

At Princeton High School he shared insights about "Ukraine: culture, traditions, political and economic situation, daily life in Soviet and post-Soviet Ukraine."
