Federal Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund-Emergency Financial Aid Summary of Grants to Students for Fiscal Year 2021

Bluefield State College (BSC) has received Federal HEERF I, II and ARPA funding:

- 1. BSC has signed and returned to the U. S. Dept. of Education the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the college will use the applicable amounts of the funds designated under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs to provide Emergency Financial Grants to Students. The amounts received under these programs for emergency financial aid to students are as follows:
 - a. HEERF I \$ 648,087
 - **b.** HEERF II 648,087
 - **c.** ARPA 2,069,791
- 2. BSC received and distributed \$463,525 to our students enrolled as of March 27, 2020, as documented in our report dated July 3, 2020.
- 3. During the academic year 2020-21, the College provided \$192,179 of emergency aid to students from the HEERF I funding for emergency aid to students. The College also provided aid to students, in the amounts of \$903,407 and \$412,695 from the Institutional and HBCU HEERF funding, respectively. See the Institutional reports for each quarter that are posted to the BSC website.
- 4. The total number of students eligible for funding during academic year 20-21 was 1,435. A total of 679 students received student aid and tuition discounts from the Student Aid, Institutional and HBCU HEERF funding.
- 5. The following aid was distributed to students:
 - a. Payments of \$750 per student to Pell eligible students for Fall 2020 and \$250 per student to certain Pell eligible students for Spring 2021, for a total of \$427,272.
 - b. Total payments of \$606,117 to Pell eligible students who had academic or athletic merit.
 - c. Total payments of \$249,923 to non-resident students with expected family contributions less than \$12,000, to pay the difference between their level of non-resident tuition and the next lower rate.

- d. Tuition discounts to non-Pell eligible students who had academic or athletic merit and for non-resident students to bring their rates to the next lower rate, in the amount of \$218,427.
- **e.** Payments to students for books, in the amount of \$6,542.
