The instructor holds the final responsibility for assessing penalties in cases of academic dishonesty, including instances involving the use of Al-generated content without proper acknowledgment.

Any cases of plagiarism or cheating will be promptly referred to the Vice President for Academic Affairs and Dean for further action. Additional penalties may be imposed for particularly egregious instances of plagiarism or cheating, especially if they involve the use of Al-generated content.

Charges of academic dishonesty may be filed by any member of the academic community and will be thoroughly reviewed at the departmental and/or school level by the Dean, faculty member, and student

involved. The maximum penalty for such misconduct may result in a grade of "F" in the course, without the option to withdraw.

If the student denies guilt or the Dean deems the penalties insufficient for a specific act, the case shall be forwarded in writing to the Vice President for Academic Affairs. At this stage, the case may be resolved, or if requested in writing by the student or considered necessary by the Vice President for Academic Affairs, it shall be referred to the Academics Committee.

The Academics Committee will notify the accused student and the person making the accusation in writing, providing clear details of the charges and the evidence to be presented in support of the claims. The Committee's recommendations for sanctions in cases of academic dishonesty are final. Moreover, the Committee may recommend the suspension of sanctions where appropriate.

It is the duty of each student to adhere to this Honor Code and promote academic integrity throughout their educational journey at Bluefield State University. Let us strive to create an environment of trust, respect, and originality in all academic endeavors.
