Policy: Credentials for University Instructors

1. Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to establish guidelines and criteria for the credentials required for university instructors. This policy aims to ensure that instructors possess the necessary qualifications and expertise to deliver high-quality education and meet the standards set by the university.

2. Scope

This policy applies to all university instructors, including full-time faculty, part-time instructors, adjunct faculty members, and dual enrollment instructors.

3. Policy Statement

3.1 Minimum Qualifications

University instructors must hold a minimum of a master's degree in the relevant field or discipline from an accredited institution. The University adheres to the credentials and standards for programs that hold specialized accreditation (ACBSP, ABET, etc.). Accredited program standards can be found <u>here</u>.

- a) Faculty teaching general education courses at the undergraduate level: doctorate or master's degree in the teaching discipline or master's degree with a concentration in the teaching discipline (a minimum of 18 graduate semester hours in the teaching discipline).
- b) Faculty teaching associate degree courses: a minimum of a bachelor's degree in the teaching discipline.
- c) Faculty teaching baccalaureate courses: doctorate or master's degree in the teaching discipline or master's degree with a concentration in the teaching discipline (minimum of 18 graduate semester hours in the teaching discipline).
- d) Faculty teaching graduate and post-baccalaureate course work: earned doctorate/terminal degree in the teaching discipline or a related discipline (unless otherwise specified by the programmatic accrediting body).

3.2 Credential Verification

The university will establish processes to verify the credentials of instructors at the time of hiring. This may involve requesting official transcripts, validating degrees with the issuing institutions, contacting references, and conducting background checks as necessary.

4. Exceptions and Waivers

Unless stated otherwise by programmatic accreditation minimum standards, in exceptional cases where an individual does not meet the minimum qualifications or terminal degree requirement, the department or academic unit may request an exception or waiver utilizing tested experience. Such requests must be accompanied by a detailed justification outlining the candidate's exceptional qualifications, experience, or expertise that demonstrate their ability to effectively teach the course.
