2025-2026 Academic Year – Additional Proposal Information

- 1. Move away from triple room spaces, but continue with the option for those who have interest (14 triple room housing applications in 2024-2025) for recruitment & retention support.
- 2. Increase double room spaces with a cost increase because of popularity, in alignment with sister institutions, & offer single & double room deluxe suite options to also increase revenue.
- 3. Address waivers creatively with discounts, scholarships and athletic department focused efforts on new/different recruiting priorities & consider restricting any full housing waivers to triple room assignments for cost savings.
- 4. The Sophomore residency requirement (119 current freshman, 41 sophomore & 44 junior students) should improve student occupancy based on residence hall student retention rates.
- 5. Transfer students will have the same requirement based on credit hours (30|F 60|S 90|J 120|S).
- 6. The \$200.00 Room Deposit will continue to be required for ALL students (prohibit scholarships & waivers to be used for deposits).
- 7. Continue to examine all options for cost savings related to Room Expenses.
- 8. The estimated cost of completing Building A for student housing is yet to be determined. If this expense is not possible for 2025, Option 3, has the possible flexibility for an increase in bed spaces with Cottage Beds & additional triple room assignments.

Banner Document Management (BDM)

- The Office of Admissions is one of the first offices on campus to use the BDM allowing for more efficient processing and the elimination of continual printing costs and is ultimately leading to the elimination of paper files within the office.
- Documents readily accessible through the various platforms. Banner and Recruit can ultimately allow more rapid decision making and to allow counselors to have all pertinent information at-hand when speaking to a potential student or school counselor.
- While in the beginning stages of the program, we can already see the benefits of accessibility and are working to streamline the application process.



Recruit CRM

- Continued training and use of Recruit is paramount to the Office of Admissions.
- Communications are readily being sent to all inquiries and applicants to nudge potential students through the application process.
- While we have had some hiccups, as expected, continued use of the Ellucian Recruit will expedite and deliver continued positive results.
- The Office of Admissions has recently partnered with the Deans to engage a school-based communication suite to work alongside the current general communication provided to each student allowing more custom information to be delivered to our prospective student population.



Admissions Counselor Schedules/Plans

- Admissions counselors have been traveling to our primary recruiting areas throughout the West Virginia and Virginia ACRO tour schedule.
- This allows Bluefield State to be introduced to students outside of our primary local recruiting areas, increasing our footprint throughout both Virginias.
- The Admissions Office will continue to serve our local area of emphasis with in-person visits at our local high schools. Counselors are currently on the road 3-4 days a week representing B-State at high schools, vocational-technical schools, community college transfer fairs, etc.
- Recruit will permit counselors to have instantaneous and directed communications with students outside of our reasonable travel area.
- With new counselors on-board, and the hopes of additional staff, the Office of Admissions is optimistic about increasing our reach in areas, both local and abroad.
